


The Location

The Environment

The College has industry-leading relationships with professional clubs and universities. These enhance the delivery of the game in the school and provide pathways for many talented players. Academy partnerships with ITFC, Ealing Trailfinders and Brunel University are examples of these. The school is an accredited TASS Dual Career Centre and offers the BTEC Performance Support Course, which enables aspirational players to study in the morning and train every afternoon.

Sport and Physical Education is delivered by an experienced team of industry-leading sports coaches and teacher, supplemented by well-qualified support staff, including full-time strength and conditioning coaches. The College proudly hosts one of the world's most prestigious schoolboy sporting events – hosted by the College in October each year – is the premier Under 18 competition in Europe if not the world.



Sport at St Jo's

Sport and exercise are an integral part of St Joseph's College. Both are valued and important dimensions of life for all pupils. The school has a clear mission to be the premier school for sport and wellbeing in East Anglia and beyond. The vision Is to develop the best in every individual through sport and physical activity via a programme that is inclusive, flexible and aspirational. St Jo's is a school where all boys and girls participate enthusiastically and many strive to excel.

St Joseph's is one of very few independent schools accredited as a TASS Dual Career Centre. Many pupils win representative honours at regional and national levels and are successful at the highest levels. In 2022-23, the U18 Girls' Football team won the County Cup, ISFA Trophy and the ESFA Cup; the 1st XV finished 5th in our 37th Annual Rugby Festival and is currently enjoying the most successful season in recent years.

St Jo's hosts the long-established and prestigious National Schools Rugby Festival in October every year, attracting the strongest teams across the UK for a weekend. We are currently developing equivalent competitions in Sevens, Netball, Football, and an ambitious plan to export this model overseas.

Sport at the College has always been outward-facing and innovative. For example, there are formal Academy partnerships with Ealing Trailfinders, Ipswich Town FC and the Women's Super League Academy. Work is underway to enhance these arrangements universities and sport organisations in the UK and abroad. It is an exciting time for sports development at the College.
