# The Responsibility

As an EAL (English as an Additional Language) Instructor, you will be responsible for delivering high-quality English language instruction to learners both in online and face-to-face settings. Whilst most of your teaching will be delivered on site and face to face, some of your teaching may well be delivered online to our international partner schools, this will require some flexibility regarding starting hours. Above all, irrespective as to delivery, your role is to create engaging lessons that cater to students' language proficiency levels and facilitate their language development effectively.

- **1. Language Instruction**: Design and deliver effective English language lessons appropriate to the learners' proficiency levels.
- Curriculum Development: Develop curriculum materials, lesson plans, and assessments that align with students' language learning goals and objectives.
- **3. Classroom Management**: Create a supportive and engaging learning environment that encourages student participation and interaction.
- **4. Assessment and Progress Monitoring**: Conduct regular assessments to evaluate students' language proficiency and monitor their progress.
- **5. Individualized Instruction**: Provide individualized support and instruction to meet the diverse needs of learners.
- **6. Cultural Sensitivity and Development**: Foster cultural awareness and sensitivity in language teaching to promote understanding and respect for diverse backgrounds. Part of the role will be in helping international students acclimatize themselves to an English school and to English culture
- **7. Collaboration**: Work collaboratively with other instructors, staff, and stakeholders to support students' language development and academic success.
- **8. Professional Development**: Stay updated with best practices in language teaching and participate in professional development activities.

- 1. Education: A bachelor's degree in TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages), Applied Linguistics, Education, or a related field would be an advantage
- 2. Certification: Certification in TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language), TESOL, or CELTA (Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) is often required.
- **3. Experience**: Previous experience in teaching English as a second/foreign language both in online and face to face settings is beneficial. Experience working with diverse learner populations is desirable.
- **4. Technology** proficiency in using technology for teaching purposes.
- **5. Language Proficiency**: Proficiency in English is essential. Proficiency in other languages relevant to the student population may be an advantage.
- **6. Interpersonal Skills**: Strong communication and interpersonal skills are necessary to interact effectively with students and colleagues from diverse backgrounds.
- **7. Cultural Competence**: Cultural awareness and sensitivity are important for fostering a welcoming and inclusive learning environment.
- **8. Knowledge**: previous experience in preparing students for IELTs and/or the Cambridge language examinations is desirable.

- Knowledge of language acquisition theories and methodologies.
- Experience with language assessment tools and techniques.
